I find it interesting to note that a central figure like Mary actually says very little throughout the gospels. Short of her dialogue with Gabriel and her proclamation of the Magnificat, Mary speaks little else. Even in today's gospel that celebrates Mary's recognition as Mother of God, Mary says nothing at all. But one thing this gospel does say about Mary is that after all the events of Christmas have transpired, "Mary kept all these things, reflecting on them in her heart." Like a true disciple, Mary notices the events around her and reflects on them in her heart in order to understand their deeper meaning. Mary exhibits the first stage of the spiritual process, discernment; a process that will help her confront the darkness she will experience later in her life.

As one like us in all things except sin, Mary is the perfect disciple. Not only by her yes, but also by her constant reflection on the events of her life she becomes an example for us of how we are to live as disciples of her Son. In order to discern the ways of God and how God is interacting with us, we too need to discern the signs of the times in our lives; the times when God is informing us of God's inflowing love. This is the love that informs us of who we truly are, daughters and sons of God. And so, like Mary, we need to center our lives and to listen to the God who comes and speaks to us in the silence of our hearts. "How blessed are you, Virgin Mary, for you carried

within you the Lord, the Creator of the world. Our creator has become human, born of a Virgin. O God you have made us sharers in the divinity of Christ, who humbles himself to share in our humanity. Bless our world with the peace which Christ came to bring us, as we pray in Jesus' name. Amen."

As we prepare to celebrate a New Year, typically we reflect, first on what the last year has wrought us – how did we succeed at keeping the promises we made. Perhaps not very well! So as the new year begins we again make promises – promises to renew ourselves, promises to set our priorities straight or promises to be the best that we can be. As we enter this annual process of renewal, perhaps we can take a cue from Mary the Mother of God.

According to Mary the Mother of God this human drama of renewal is spirituality charged. Our heart connection to God is what has generated the dream because it is God, through the inflowing of God's love who has informed of us of who we truly are, daughters and sons of God. This is what it means when we say that Mary is the Mother of God; through her the divine and human meet. And so as we go about the annual process to evaluate and to resolve, at root is really our identities as daughters and sons of God for resolving to be new in the coming year is really resolving to be faithful to who we are.

Happy New Year to all and in this New Year, may you experience the joy and love that flows from a God

that wants you to live fully in the light of God's love!

**Prepare for Epiphany, January 8**

Is 60:1-6; Ps 72:1-2,7-8,10-11,12-13; Eph 3:2-3,5-6; Mt 2:1-12 God's plan, hidden in ages past, was fully revealed in Jesus. In this age of grace, Jesus is God's *epiphany*, God's manifestation on the earth. In Jesus we can walk in God's ways, serving the people with justice and mercy. In Jesus, all people are sharers of God's gifts, members of the same body, sons and daughters of God. Though Jesus illuminates the path to God, not everyone can see it and follow it. The Herods of the world, who rule through domination and violence, are greatly disturbed by any threat to their wealth and power. The dark clouds of fear they create obscure the path to peace.

Only the wise ones — apostles, prophets, magi, women and men who can see with the eyes of the heart — are able to perceive God's appearance. They speak God's words to the lost, the alienated, and the downcast: "Look up and see!" Hearts that are broken throb with joy and gratitude. When we raise our eyes, we see God's glory and walk by God's light. No longer do we follow the paths of the world; we take another route. The light of Christ guides us to our true home.

**For Reflection:** *Do I disclose God's light to others? What gifts can I offer them today?*

**Prepare for Baptism of the Lord, MONDAY January 9**

Is 42:1-4,6-7; Ps 29:1-2,3-4,3,9-10; Acts 10:34-38; Mk 1:7-11 The voice crying out in the desert is as powerful as the one sweeping over the waters at creation. It is as commanding as the voice that led the people through the sea to freedom. It thunders like the voice heard on Mount Sinai, and it is as strong as the voice that shook the rafters of the temple. The voice is the prophet John proclaiming the coming of God's reign. In Jesus, God's voice is mighty and powerful, yet gentle and healing. His words summon the people from the

prisons of oppression and open the eyes of all who live in darkness. In his baptism, the heavens are torn open, and the Spirit of God descends as gently as a dove. The loving voice of the Father speaks: "You are my beloved Son. On you my favor rests."

Peter learns that God's favor rests on everyone. God has no favorites, shows no partiality. All are God's "chosen people." Whoever enters the waters of baptism is welcome in the house of God. God speaks to us as God spoke to Jesus: "You are my beloved child. On you my favor rests."

**For Reflection:** *Do I experience God's liberating voice in my life? Am I living my baptismal call to bring mercy and justice to others?*

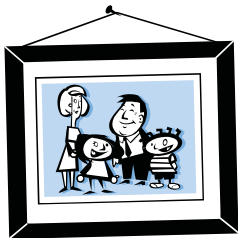

**Taking it Home:** Some people think that Christmas is one holiday and New Year's is another holiday, but the Church keeps the first of January as one of the days of Christmastime. The rejoicing of December 25 belongs to January 1 as well.

The gospel for mass today is short. But it gives us several reasons to rejoice. And it gives us the reason for many titles that the first of January has had over the years. The gospel, from the second chapter of Luke, is a continuation of the story we began at Midnight Mass on Christmas. Today we hear that the shepherds did what the angels told them to do. They found Mary and Joseph and the newborn Jesus. Then they went to tell their neighbors that a Savior was born.

Mary treasured what was said about her child. In joy, the shepherds sang the angels song of glory in heaven and peace on earth. Eight days after his birth, Jesus was circumcised and received his name, which means "Savior."

Today is the World Day of Prayer for Peace. For some Churches, today is the feast of the Holy Name of Jesus or the feast of the Circumcision. For Roman Catholics, today is the Solemnity of Mary the Mother of God. This Solemnity is over 150 years old on the

Church's calendar. We celebrate today the fulfillment of the promise made to Mary by the angel Gabriel. God's child is now her child. Mary is the Mother of God. (Companion to the Calendar; Mary Ellen Hynes). (Deacon John)
