LITURGY

The Midsummer Nativity: June 24 is the birth of St. John the Baptist. This day is called Midsummer Day because we are halfway between the beginning of spring and beginning of autumn. Six months ago we celebrated the birth of Christ. A half year has gone by. Now we celebrate another birth. St. John's Day sometimes is called "Summer Christmas."

John the Baptist said, "Christ must increase, but I must decrease." What do you think John meant? Ever since Christmas, daytime has been growing long and nighttime shorter. But now that summer is here, daytime begins to grow shorter and nighttime longer. Like John the Baptist, daytime is decreasing, too.

Jesus is called the light and John is called the lamp that holds the light. At baptism, we received the light of Jesus. We became lamps! Long ago, nighttime bonfires in honor of St. John were set blazing. Maybe that is why fireworks are so popular this time of year. Even fireflies seem to be celebrating with their own little lamps. Some people set out luminarias (paper bags with sand in the bottom and a lighted candle inside) to light a path to their front door to "prepare the way of the Lord."

Even if your "bonfire" is in a barbecue grill, bless it on St. John's Day with these words:

O God almighty, unfailing ray and source of all light, sanctify this fire that we have kindled in joy at the birth of John, the herald of your Son, and grant that, after darkness of this life, we may come to you, who are light eternal. Amen.

Reflection 12th Sunday in Ordinary Time: "*The Lord addressed Job out of the storm and said*" (Job 38:1)

The winter and spring drought which plagued much of Florida came to a bold and dramatic conclusion in early June, when a steep rain deficit was overcome by deluges that brought a surplus—and severe flooding, in some cases! When the puddles eventually dried out, the grass and the trees, parched from the drought, sprang out in fresh, beautiful, and bold shades of green. The landscape was renewed, but after the storms and the suffering they brought, people wondered what might come next.

After the Paschal "deluge" of the Easter Season (and first communions and confirmations and ordinations and weddings) and the Solemnities of the Holy Trinity and the Body and Blood of Christ, we might not be suffering, but we might be ready for the Lord to speak to us out of the calm after the storm. What shall he say to us? Take a break, rest? ... the real question is this: Where do we find God's fullness now? And how do we find the divine fullness even in stormy times? We have been sprinkled; we have sung our hearts out; we have theologized, vocalized, processed, and adored, celebrating the fullness of God's love for us as manifested through Christ Jesus the Lord! Has all of this prepared us to hear God in the storms as well as in the quiet?

In the green Sundays of Ordinary Time we will hear Jesus invite us to "come to a deserted place and rest," to recognize the "Bread of Life," and to "Be opened!" How will we use this time to appreciate how the spiritual landscape of our lives has been renewed and is being made new every day?

O Lord, help us to celebrate your love in simple and tender ways. Let us hear your voice in the stillness and in the storms we encounter, and renew us with your life-giving Spirit!
